

The Local Control Funding Formula



- The starting point for LCFF in 2013-14 is funding received in 2012-13 for:
 - Revenue limits (deficited)
 - More than 40 different categorical programs or the charter school block grant (deficited)
- The amount of revenue received in 2012-13 is the basis for the first year of LCFF implementation

The Local Control Funding Formula



- □ District will receive and estimate of \$17.27M of base and supplemental grant funding by 2020-21
- □ 11.78% or \$2.04M of the increase will be received in 2013-14
- □ It is not known what percentage allocation of the additional funding will be received each year
- Requires a Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP)
- □ 2013-14 is the transition year, State funding will be subject to the LCAP in 2014-15



Spending Control in the LCFF

- Discretion regarding content of the LCAP
- Relaxed proportionality rules
- Ability to use concentration and supplemental grant funds for school and districtwide purposes subject to the SBE regulations
- No MOE requirements

- State priorities are specific but broad in scope
- SBE tasked with making changes to API based on the LCFF and adopting spending regulations and LCAP templates
- SPI continues to have academic oversight responsibilities






Present for review and comment to:

- Parent advisory committee
- English learner parent advisory committee
- The superintendent must respond in writing to comments received

Opportunity for public input:

- Notice of the opportunity to submit written comment
- Public hearing
- The superintendent must respond in writing to comments received

Adoption of the plan:

- Adopted concurrent with the LEA's budget
- Submitted to COE for approval
- Posted on district website
- COE posts LCAP for each district/school or a link to the LCAP

Consultation with:

- Teachers
- Principals
- School personnel
- Pupils
- Local bargaining units

What is the Plan at the District Level?



- On or before July 1, 2014, and every three years thereafter, the district must adopt the LCAP using the template adopted by the State
- The District's LCAP must include a description of the following:
 - Stakeholder Engagement
 - Goals, Progress, and Indicators
 - Actions, Services, and Expenditures
- It will take District-wide actions and actions by school sites
 - For each fiscal year of the plan, the District must list and describe expenditures implementing specific actions included in the LCAP
 - The District must list and describe expenditures serving "unduplicated" students and students redesignated as fluent English proficient

What is the Plan at the District Level?



- Great opportunity for us to look at how we spend our dollars and how our goals align with the State's priorities
- District will ensure communication and alignment with all stakeholders, i.e surveys, committees
- LCAP timeline is in progress and will be presented to the Board by June, 2014
- District will be communicating about LCAP to staff and parents for review and comments
- Information about LCAP will be posted on the District's website
- Meeting notes and any updates will be posted on the District's website



- EIA funding will be rolled into the LCFF in 2014-15. This funding is now a part of the district-wide LCAP plan
- School site plans should align with LCAP
- All stakeholders should began assessing current program alignment with state priorities and what supplemental services are needed
- LCAP will be similar to a District-wide school site planning document
