Partnerships

The Board of Trustees encourages business, industry, and outside agencies to participate with our schools to prepare pupils for challenges they will meet in the future. The Superintendent or designee shall invite members of the local business community to serve on advisory committees, designee programs, and provide needs assessments, program evaluations, and/or other staff development for staff. The partnerships may also provide classroom assistance, individual tutoring, incentive and recognition programs, and employment opportunities.

The Board of Trustees also encourages private industries to contribute funds and equipment to further the districts' educational program. To prepare for a future of expanding technological tools, students need access to adequate equipment

The Board of Trustees urges employers to further support the schools by recognizing their employees' needs as parents. Employers are requested to accommodate these needs by supporting parent involvement with their children's schools through release time for parent/teacher communication and providing child care and child services.
