4.2	Dr. Roxane Fuentes, Superintendent
Discussion	Dr. Fuentes referred to the infographic detailing the strategic plan as she summarized the process and the newly revised strategic plan. 45 representatives across Berryessa's constituent groups come Together every 6 months to give input on the plan. The focus this time was not to change goals, but was to Review progress made and plan the next steps for action items under each goal. The priorities of section one of the strategic plan are: Recruitment of Special Education Specialists, SLPs, and Paraeducators. In order to do this, the district plans to revamp the Berryessa EdJoin page and also provide coaching support to Special Education Teachers. The priorities of section two of the strategic plan are focus on Certificated and Classified coaching Employees with a classified mentoring program, Google Suite /Infinite Campus training, Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS), and behavior management training. The priorities of section three of the strategic plan focus on Digital citizenship curriculum training, emergency preparedness training, and additional gates/fencing at sites. The priorities of section four of the strategic plan focus on parent and community and community engagement strategies including: updating school websites, community outreach action planning, parent information video messages, establishing a fundraising advisory committee, and planning for Language specific Kinder orientations for the fall. The priorities of section five of the strategic plan are: increasing math and ELA SBAC scores overall by 5% was set, more data analysis and differentiation, increasing the educational program options for fall 2019, evaluate instructional coaching model, and dual immersion program recruitment.

4.4	Dr. Joseph McCreary	
Discussion	ELPAC (formerly CELDT) has two parts; the initial and the summative. 432 of our students were assessed and as a result, 157 students were designated Initial Fully English Proficient (IFEP). The other students were classified or remained classified as English Learners (EL). April 14, 2019, the reclassification ceremony will be held for the former EL students who are IFEP and RFEP. The district administered the SBAC test to 4,709	
	The SBAC test to 99% of the student population. The SBAC data shows BUSD increased 2% overall in ELA and 2% in math.	
	Math overall. BUSD has many schools that achieved double-digit SBAC assessment score increases.	
Dr. Fuentes shared a request from the district trustees at the board meeting 10/16/18, that BUSD set targets for the district's subgroups. The district will be doing this, this year.
