LCAP Goal #1 Educational Partners Status is "In Progress"

- Dr. Fuentes reiterated Attendance and Chronic Absenteeism a "problematic" data due to Covid and quarantine. Governor and State Legislature working on a solution to resolve discrepancy, particularly in the area of school funding for 2022-23 school year.
- Analysis and Metrics indicate positive outcomes of implemented programs (student well-being, SEL, social workers)

LCAP Goal #2 Student Achievement & Professional Development is "Complete" (?)

- ELL achievement met; Language Arts met; Mathematics met in Elementary.
- Dr. Fuentes noted schools with lower than 95% SBAC participation rate incur penalty in overall score. Covid increases may have affected participation rate, thus Districts would like to see both displays of scores with and without the penalty

• Analysis and Metrics indicate changes and additional actions in addition to continuing previous actions: Additional PD, supplemental Math in M.S.; ELOP opportunity where grant monies are allocated to expansion of summer and/or after school learning/enrichment programs

LCAP Goal #3 Parent Engagement and Involvement is "In Progress" (?)

- Panoramic Survey only 14% this year
- Covid restriction limited Parent Engagement sessions
- Collected ideas to increase survey participation (verify multiple language accessibility) and possible streaming of District Board meetings at new D.O. location in 2022-23 school year
- 4.2 May Revise Update Kevin Franklin
  - Governor proposals outline, but still under negotiation with state legislature
  - Increased statutory COLA from 5.33% to 6.56%, due to inflation
  - Base grant increase in LCFF
  - Proposed ADA relief either basing funding on greater ADA from previous year, or a 3 year ADA average
  - \$8B Discretionary funds Block grant for LEA, equivalent to \$1500 per ADA
  - Deferred Maintenance/Facilities Funding based on UPP count
  - Expanded Learning Opportunity Program (ELO-P) \$4.8B for 2022-23, about \$2500 per classroom based on ADA
- 5. Open Discussion/Future Agenda Items
  - Question re: Funding based off Free/Reduced lunch application and how to increase applicants/ Discussion whether to steer form as a school funding application rather than for school lunch program. Online application is available
  - Budget Reduction Committee Update: First meeting held 5/16/22; Committee includes 2 members from each of 3 Unions, Administrators, and 3-4 Parents, about 15-16 people
