4.1 Dr. Joseph McCreary
Discussion

Dr. Joseph McCreary gave information about the surveys that were took by the parents about dual immersion programs. Based on the feedback from parent surveys, there is an interest mainly for two languages. Spanish and Mandarin. This new program will start with 10% English instruction and 90% Mandarin (or Spanish) in K class. Every year the percentage for English instruction will increase 10% and the by 5th grade students will start to receive 50% -50% instruction. An extension for dual language program in middle school will be Considered.

So far, BUSD received interest for one Kindergarten class of students for Dual Language Program in Mandarin, For Spanish program, the required number for a class size is still 6-7 short.

BUSD Education Services personnel are visiting other successful Dual Immersion programs to get information, like Cupertino and Palo Alto Dual immersion programs.

They are also planning to visit several TK classes for student recruitment for Kindergarten Dual Immersion

Dr. Joseph McCreary clarified the changes in new extended Kindergarten schedule.

- There will be early dismissal during first 4 weeks of school for Kinder. Regular schedule will start 5th
- Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday ,Friday 300 instructional minutes Thursdays 240 instructional
- Kinder teachers will have aides in their classroom 2.5 hours/day

There will be meetings with Kindergarten teachers to collaborate on effective instruction for extended K. Teachers will decide on a resource wish-list to support them during extended day.
