CDPH Reopening Schools Health Framework and Guidance

- January 14, 2021 - CDPH Reopening Schools Health Framework and Guidance
- New Metrics
 - Eligibility for K-6 Purple Tier Reopening health metrics
 - Below 25 cases per 100,000 (adjusted case rate) over 5 consecutive days
 - COVID-19 Safety Plan consists of CPP & CDPH COVID-19 Schools Checklist
 - COVID-19 Schools Checklist Consultation with Stakeholders
 - COVID-19 Safety Plan must be submitted to the state and local PHD for approval
 - Reopening eligibility for K-12 once in Red Tier for at least 5 consecutive days
- New Recommended Safety Measures
 - Surgical masks for staff who have routine contact with others
 - Testing cadences dependent on adjusted case rate and tier status
- New school reopening proposal pending from the State Legislature

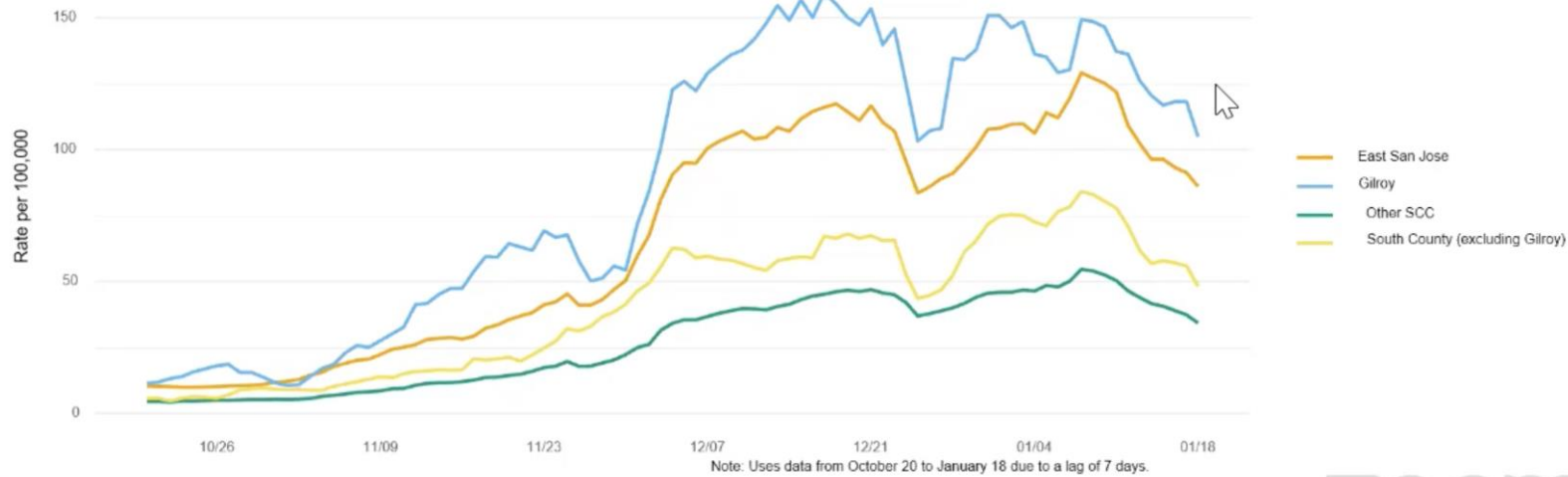
COVID-19 Across Santa Clara County

COVID-19 Relief Funds

8

- Federal
 - Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief II (ESSER II) - approx. \$6.7 Billion for CA
 - Governor's Emergency Education Relief (GEER) - approx. \$400 Million for CA
 - Extension of the deadline of Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF) from 12/30/20 to 12/31/21
- State
 - Still in discussion with Legislature
