Charter Schools

Petition Signatures

To be considered by the Board of Trustees, a charter school petition must be signed by one of the following: (Ed Code 47605)

- 1. A number of parents/guardians equivalent to at least one-half (1/2) of the number of students that the charter school estimates will enroll in the charter school for its first year of operation.
- 2. A number of teachers equivalent to at leave one-half (1/2) of the number of teachers that the charter school estimates will be employed at the school during its first year of operation.
- 3. At least 50% of the permanent status teachers currently employed at the public school to be converted if the charter petition calls for an existing public school to be converted to a charter school.

Charter Provisions

A charter petition shall include descriptions of all of the following: (Ed Code 47605, 47611.5)

- 1. The educational program of the school, designed among other things to identify those whom the school is attempting to educate, what it means to be an "educated person" in the 21st century and how learning best occurs. The goals identified in that program shall include the objective of enabling students to become self-motivated, competent and lifelong learners.
- 2. The measurable student outcomes identified for use by the charter school. "Student outcomes" means the extent to which all students of the school demonstrate that they have attained the skills, knowledge and attitudes specified as goals in the school's educational program.
- 3. The method by which student progress in meeting those student outcomes is to be measured.
- 4. The governance structure of the school, including but not limited to the process to be followed by the school to ensure parent/guardian involvement.
- 5. The qualifications to be met by individuals to be employed by the school.
- 6. The procedures that the school will follow to ensure the health and safety of students and staff. These procedures shall include the requirement that each school employee

furnish the school with a criminal record summary as described in Education Code 44237.

- 7. The means by which the school will achieve a racial and ethnic balance among its students that is reflective of the general population residing within the district's territorial jurisdiction.
- 8. Admission requirements if applicable.
- 9. The manner in which annual, independent financial audits shall be conducted, which shall employ generally accepted accounting principles, and the manner in which audit exceptions and deficiencies shall be resolved to the satisfaction of the Board.
- 10. The procedures by which students can be suspended or expelled.
- 11. The manner by which staff members of the charter schools will be covered by the State Teachers' Retirement System, the Public Employees' Retirement System or federal social security.
- 12. The public school attendance alternatives for students residing within the district who choose not to attend charter schools.
- 13. A description of the rights of any district employee upon leaving district employment to work in a charter school, and of any rights of return to the district after employment at a charter school.
- 14. The procedures to be followed by the charter school and the Board to resolve disputes relating to charter provisions.
- 15. A declaration as to whether or not the charter school shall be deemed the exclusive public school employer of the school's employees for purposes of collective bargaining under Government Code 3540-3549.3.

The petition shall also include affirmations that: (Ed Code 47605)

- 1. The charter school shall be nonsectarian in its programs, admission policies, employment practices and all other operations; shall not charge tuition; and shall not discriminate against any student on the basis of ethnicity, national origin, gender or disability.
- 2. The charter school shall admit all students who wish to attend the school, according to the following criteria and procedures:
 - a. Admission to the charter school shall not be determined according to the student's place of residence, or that of his/her parents/guardians, within this state, except that any existing public school converting partially or entirely to a charter school

shall adopt and maintain a policy giving admission preference to students who reside within the school's former attendance area.

- b. If the number of students who wish to attend the charter school exceeds the school's capacity, attendance, except for existing students of the charter school, shall be determined by a public random drawing. Preferences shall be extended to students currently attending the charter school and students who reside in the district. In the event of a drawing, the Board shall make reasonable efforts to accommodate the growth of the charter school and shall not take any action to impede the charter school from expanding enrollment to meet student demand.
- c. Other admissions preferences permitted by the Board on an individual school basis and if consistent with law.

In addition to submitting the proposed charter and the affirmations described above, charter school petitioners shall provide information to the Board regarding the proposed operation and potential effects of the school, including but not limited to: (Ed Code 47605)

- 1. The facilities to be used by the school.
- 2. The manner in which administrative services of the school are to be provided.
- 3. Potential civil liability effects, if any, upon the school and district.
- 4. Financial statements that include a proposed first-year operational budget, including start-up costs, and cash flow and financial projections for the first three years of operation.

Charter Approval / Denial

Within 30 days of receiving a petition to establish a charter school, the Board shall hold a public hearing to determine the level of support for the petition by teachers, other employees of the district and parents/guardians.

Within 60 days of receiving a petition, or within 90 days with the consent of the petitioners and the Board, the Board shall either grant or deny the request to establish a charter school. (Ed Code 47605)

The Board shall grant the charter if doing so is consistent with sound educational practice. A charter shall be denied only if the Board presents written specific factual findings that one or more of the following conditions exists: (Ed Code 47605)

1. The charter school presents an unsound educational program for the students to be enrolled in the charter school.

- 2. The petitioners are demonstrably unlikely to successfully implement the program set forth in the petition.
- 3. The petition does not contain the number of signatures required.
- 4. The petition does not contain an affirmation of each of the conditions described above and in Education Code 47605(d).
- 5. The petition does not contain reasonably comprehensive descriptions of the charter provisions described above and in Education Code 47605(b).

The Board shall not deny a petition based on the actual or potential costs of serving students with disabilities. (Ed Code 47605.7)

The Board shall not grant any charter that authorizes the conversion of a private school to a charter school. (Ed Code 47602)

In granting charter petitions, the Board shall give preference to schools best able to provide comprehensive learning experiences for academically low-achieving students according to standards established by the California Department of Education under Education Code 54032. (Ed Code 47605)

The Board may initially grant a charter for a specified term not to exceed five years. (Ed Code 47607)

The petitioners shall provide written notice of the Board's approval and a copy of the charter to the State Board of Education. (Ed Code 47605)

The approval or denial of a charter petition shall not be controlled by collective bargaining agreements nor subject to review or regulation by the Public Employment Relations Board. (Ed Code 47611.5)

Revisions

Material revisions to a charter may be made only with Board approval and shall be governed by the same standards and criteria that apply to new charter petitions as set for the in Education Code 47605. (Ed Code 47607)

Renewals

A charter school seeking renewal of the charter shall submit a written request to the Board at least 120 days before the term of the charter is due to expire.

At least 90 days before the term of the charter is due to expire, the Board shall conduct a public hearing to receive input on whether or not to extend the charter. At least 60 days before the expiration date, the Board shall either grant or deny the request for renewal.

Renewals shall be governed by the same standards and criteria that apply to new charter petitions as set forth in Education Code 47605. (Ed Code 47607)

Each renewal shall be for a period of five years. (Ed Code 47607)

Revocations

The Board may revoke a charter whenever it finds that the charter school has done any of the following: (Ed Code 47607)

- 1. Committed a material violation of any of the conditions, standards or procedures set forth in the charter.
- 2. Failed to meet or pursue any of the student outcomes identified in the charter.
- 3. Failed to meet generally accepted accounting principles or engaged in fiscal mismanagement.
- 4. Violated any provision of law.

Prior to revocation, the Board shall notify the charter school of any violation and give the school a reasonable opportunity to correct the violation unless the Board determines, in writing, that the violation constitutes a severe and imminent threat to the health or safety of the students. (Ed Code 47607)

Requirements for Charter Schools

In order to generate state funding based on average daily attendance, a charter school student shall be a California resident and, if over 19 years of age, shall be continuously enrolled in a public school and making "satisfactory progress" toward a high school diploma as defined in 5 CCR 11965. (Ed Code 47612)

No student shall be required to attend a charter school. (Ed Code 47605)

No district employee shall be required to work at a charter school. (Ed Code 47605)

Charter schools shall be exempt from the Education Code provisions governing school districts except the following:

- 1. Charter schools shall be subject to Education Code 47611 regarding the State Teachers' Retirement System. (Ed Code 47610)
- 2. Charter schools shall be subject to Education Code 41365 regarding the revolving loan fund for charter schools. (Ed Code 47610)

- 3. Charter schools shall be subject to all laws establishing minimum age for public school attendance. (Ed Code 47610)
- 4. Charter schools shall meet all statewide standards and conduct the student assessments required by Education Code 60605 and any other statewide standards or student assessments applicable to noncharter public schools. They shall certify that their students have participated in the state testing programs specified in Education Code 60600-60652 in the same manner as other students attending public schools. (Ed Code 47605, 47612.5)
- 5. Charter schools shall be subject to state law prohibitions regarding the employment of any person, in either a certificated or classified position, who has been convicted of a violent or serious felony. (Ed Code 44830.1, 45122.2)
- 6. Charter schools shall offer, at a minimum, the same number of instructional minutes set forth in Education Code 46201 for the appropriate grade levels. (Ed Code 47612.5)
- 7. Charter schools that provide independent study shall be subject to Education Code 51745-51749.3. (Ed Code 47612.5, 51747.3; 5 CCR 11705)

However, for the purposed of Education Code 51745(e), a charter school that includes any of grades 9 - 12 shall be deemed to be an alternative school of the district. (Ed Code 51745; 5 CCR 11705)

8. Charter schools shall be subject to provisions in Government Code 3540-3549.3 related to collective bargaining in public education employment. If a charter does not specify that the charter school shall comply with laws and regulations governing tenure or a merit or civil service system, the scope of representation for that charter school shall also include discipline and dismissal of charter school employees. (Ed Code 47611.5)

Teachers in charter schools shall hold a Commission on Teacher Credentialing certificate, permit or other document equivalent to that which a teacher in other public schools would be required to hold. These documents shall be maintained on file at the charter school and shall be subject to periodic inspection by the Board. (Ed Code 47605)

Students with disabilities shall be served by charter schools in the same manner as such students are served in other public schools. (Ed Code 56145)

Charter schools shall, on a regular basis, consult with parents/guardians and teachers regarding the school's educational programs. (Ed Code 47605)

Charter schools shall promptly respond to all reasonable inquires from the Board or the Superintendent of Public Instruction, including but not limited to inquires regarding its financial records. (Ed Code 47604.3)

Charter schools shall maintain written contemporaneous records that document all student attendance and shall make these records available for audit and inspection. (Ed Code 47612.5)

If a charter school submits to the district an application for a waiver of any state Education Code provisions, the Board shall hold a public hearing on the waiver request no later than 90 days following receipt of the request. (Ed Code 33054)

The Superintendent or designee shall subsequently prepare a summary of the public hearing to be forwarded with the waiver request to the State Board of Education. If the Board recommends against approval of the waiver request, it shall set forth the reasons for its disapproval in written documentation that shall be forwarded to the State Board of Education. (Ed Code 33054)

Financial Relationship

The district shall permit a charter school to use, at no cost, facilities not currently being used by the district for instructional or administrative purposes or not historically being used for rental purposes provided that the charter school shall be responsible for reasonable maintenance of those facilities. (Ed Code 47614)

The charter school may separately purchase administrative or other services from the district or any other source. (Ed Code 47613)

At the request of a charter school, the Superintendent or designee shall create and submit any reports required by the State Teacher's Retirement system and the Public Employees' Retirement system on behalf of the charter school. The charter school may be charged for the actual costs of the reporting services, but shall not be required to purchase payroll processing services from the district as a condition for creating and submitting these reports. (Ed Code 47611.3)
