

**BUSINESS****Child Nutrition Program****Cafeteria Fund**

The Board of Trustees intends that, insofar as possible, school food services shall be a self-supporting, nonprofit program. Upon recommendation of the Superintendent or designee, the Board shall review and approve meal prices. Program financial reports shall be presented regularly to the Board.

Meals may be offered to employees as a matter of convenience. Since these meals may include federally donated food commodities, their price shall be set in accordance with state and federal guidelines.

Meals may be served to adults other than employees and Board members who are on campus during meal times for a legitimate purpose, such as serving as a classroom volunteer. Since these meals may include federally donated food commodities, their price shall be set in accordance with state and federal guidelines.

**Cafeteria Fund**

The Superintendent or designee shall establish a cafeteria fund independent of the district's general fund.

The wages, salaries and benefits of child nutrition employees shall be paid from the cafeteria fund. (Education Code 38103)

To increase cost effectiveness, the Superintendent or designee shall centralize and direct the purchasing of food and supplies, the planning of menus, and the auditing of all child nutrition accounts for the district.
