COMMUNITY RELATIONS

English Learner's Advisory Committee (ELAC)

The district and school sites are required to have a functioning English Learner Advisory Committee meeting all legal requirements. Each school with more than 21 or more English Learners (also known as LEP students), regardless of language, must form a functioning English Learner Advisory Committee (ELAC) or subcommittee of an existing advisory committee.

At least fifty percent of the membership of this committee will be composed of parents of participating students.

The parents or guardians of pupils of limited-English proficiency shall elect the parent members of ELAC. All such parents shall be provided the opportunity to vote in the election. Each School's ELAC shall have the opportunity to elect <u>at least one</u> member to the District English Learner's Advisory Committee (DELAC).

District policies and all state and federal regulations regarding English Learners advisory committees will be followed.
