INSTRUCTION

Terminating Unsuccessful Programs

The Board, in the interest of maintaining an effective School Improvement Program, recognizes the need to take action in the event a school does not substantially achieve their objectives.

A District Evaluation Committee shall be formed by the Superintendent. This Committee will include instructional staff, administrative staff, and parents. The Committee will evaluate each of the School Programs. In the case of State-funded schools, this Committee will make recommendations to the Board indicating whether a school is to be terminated or continued in the State-funded program. (Refer to Administrative Guidelines, 6517.)

The Board shall reallocate State funding if, after four years, a school has not met the objectives within the approved School Plan.

If objectives for the School Program are not substantially met, the Instructional Services Department will provide assistance to the School Site Council as needed.

REFERENCE:

<u>Instruction for District Master Plan for School Improvement</u>

The Board must establish procedures for terminating implementation grants to schools which are unsuccessful over a four-year period in substantially meeting the objectives of their approved Plan. Such criteria and procedures must reflect academic achievement, program review, and other indicators of educational improvement established by the Board of Trustees. Such procedures must include funding reallocation procedures. (Education Code Section 52034(f); California Administrative Code, Title V, Section 42044(g))
