

What are Supplemental Educational Services (SES) and who qualifies?

Supplemental Educational Services (SES) is additional instruction designed to increase students' academic achievement in schools. Outside providers will offer SES to eligible students from low-income families during a school's second year of Program Improvement status. These services, which may include free academic tutoring (not homework support), are provided by outside organizations or agencies approved by the California State Board of Education, not by the school itself. SES must be provided outside the regular school day and must include interventions that are of high quality, research-based, and specifically designed to increase student academic achievement.

There are two enrollment cycles during the year for SES: fall and late winter/early spring. Applications are provided only to qualified students and must be returned to the district office.
