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Purpose

How Did We Get Here



As District enrollment decreases, revenue decreases but fixed operational costs remain the same.

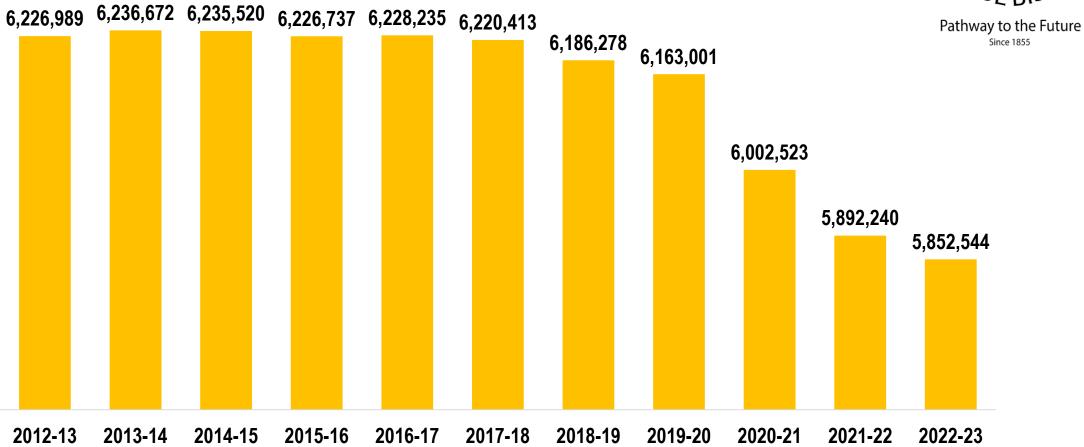
- This leaves BUSD with fewer funds for academic programs and staffing
- Revenues have decreased from \$103.7M in 2022-23 to \$88.7M in 2024-25
- Enrollment has decreased by approximately 2k students since 2012-13
- Increased number of combination classes in elementary schools
- Lack of elective class offerings in middle school



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Enrollment

In California, enrollment of K-12 students has dropped by approximately 6%.

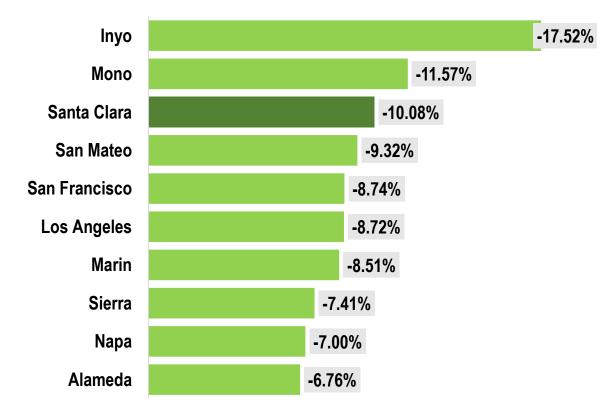

Percent Difference in Enrollment from 2019-20 to 2022-23



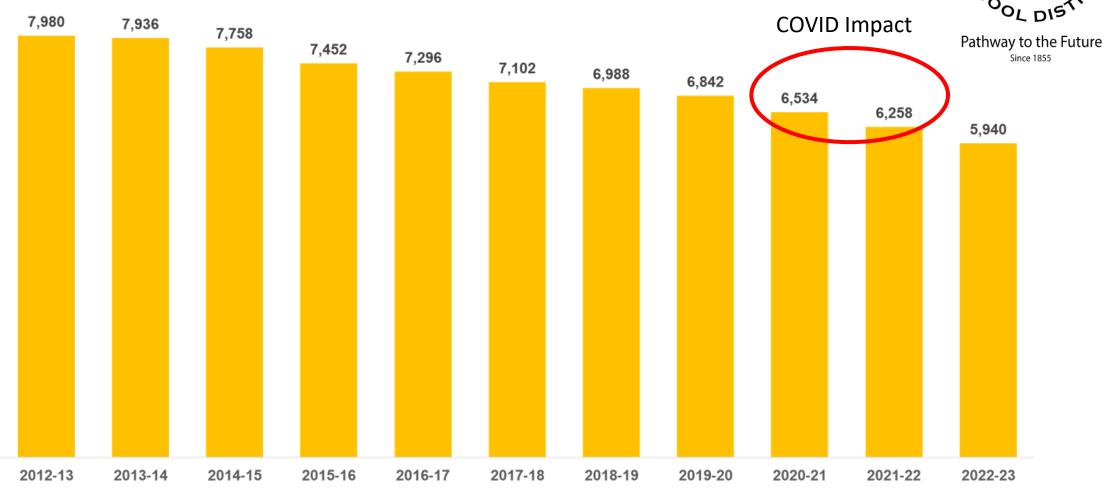
Pathway to the Future

ARYESSA,

- The statewide rate of decline for the same period was -5.03%
- The rate of decline for Berryessa Union School District (SD) for the same period was -13.18%.

The rate of decline for BUSD was -13.18% from 2019-2020 to 2022-2023.

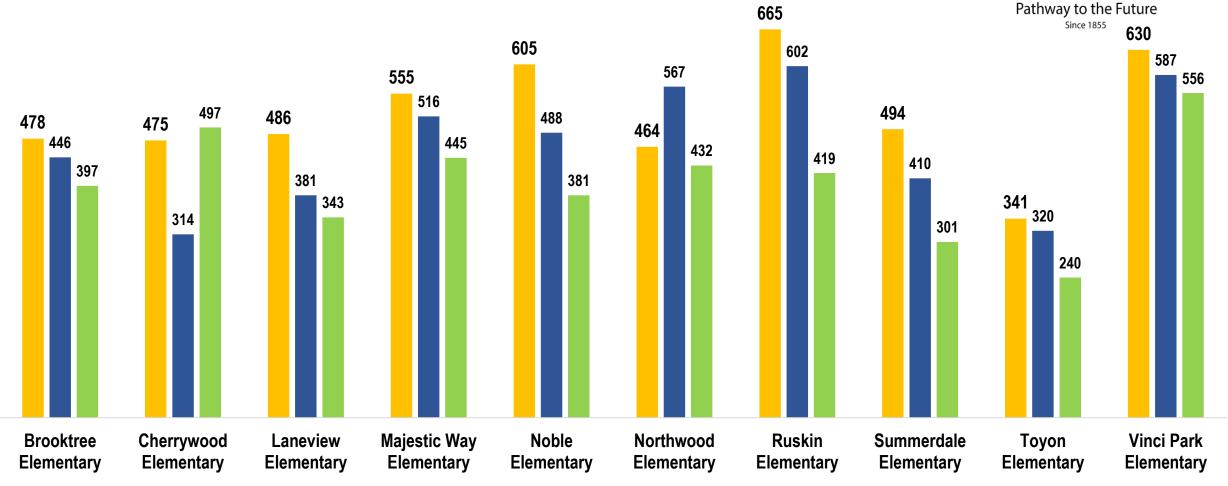

Enrollment Trends at BUSD Elementary Schools

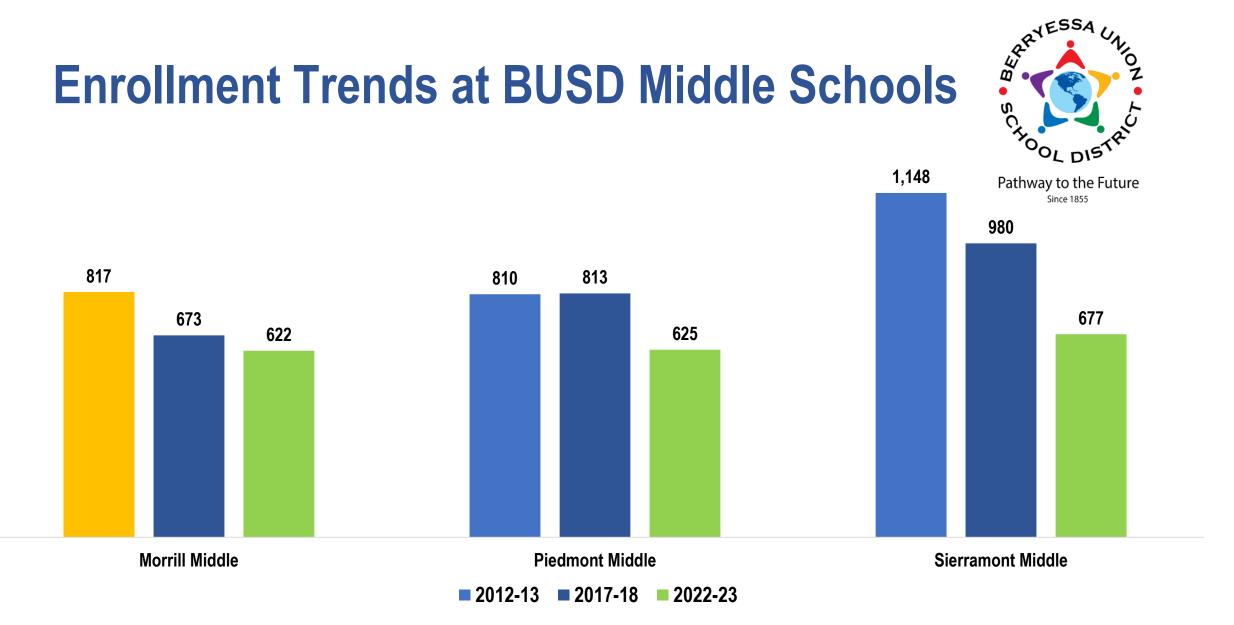

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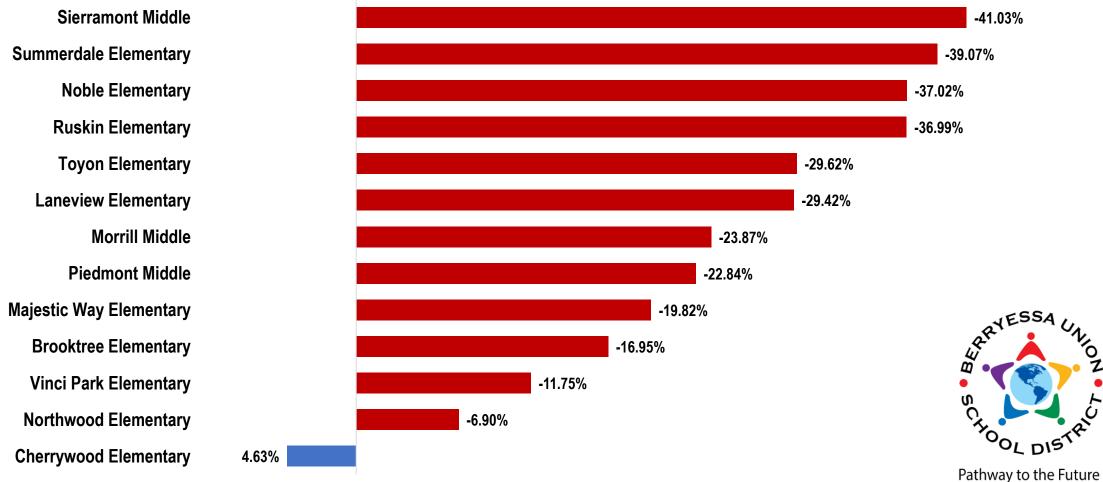
2012-13 2017-18 2022-23

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School Consolidation Timeline & Process

Addressing these challenges has been an on-going priority.

June 15, 2021 Board of Trustees adopt resolution committing to \$6M in budget reductions May 2022 – Dec. 2023 Budget Stabilization Committee formed and presented recommendations.

April 17, 2024

School Consolidation Advisory Committee Meetings



BUSD is Committed to Transparency and Community Engagement.



- The School Consolidation Advisory Committee is comprised of 23 members which include:
 - Parent representatives from each school site
 - Labor partners
 - District committee representatives
 - Staff representatives
 - Principals/administrators

- Meeting Topics/Criterion:
 - Demographic and Capacity Analysis
 - Facilities
 - Educational/Student Support Services
 - Fiscal and Other Impacts
- Identify 2-3 school sites (elementary/middle) for recommendation to the Board

School sites are under-utilized while expenses to keep sites open remain high.

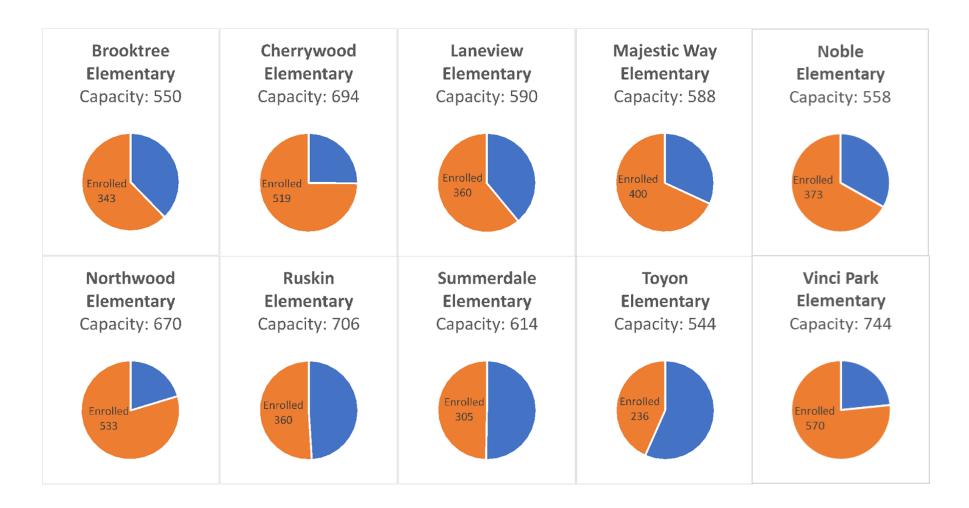
